

Oregon Nordic Club Board Minutes  
November 19, 2002

- In attendance: Lou Klump, Penney Peloquin, Roy Buntin, Alice Price, Deborah Syna, Jennifer Railsback, Joan Amero
- Membership Report: 11 new members, 133 paid members, 148 total members  
208 members have not renewed. Last November we had 202 members.  
We will be sending a reminder to members who have not renewed.
- Financial Report: Savings: \$3,819; Checking: \$17,792 (\$11,000 from tour deposits)  
The 2003 budget will be published in the December newsletter.
- Newsletter: Bruce Palamountain will be the new newsletter editor.
- Overnight Tours: The Crater Lake trip will be advertised through the Mazamas. There is still room on the Glacier trip. There has been minimal response to the family ski trip.
- Day Tours: The tour leader packets will be mailed by the end of November to past tour leaders and members who have indicated a willingness to lead tours. The packets will include a cover letter with instructions and an explanation of the non-member fee, 8 applications and tri-fold brochures, 5 liability forms and return envelopes, and a list of potential tours with general descriptions. The Day Tour Coordinators will follow up with members on the packets.
- The Board is planning a party next summer to recognize trip leaders.
- Fleecewear: Vests and jackets sporting our ONC logo are now available through L.L. Bean. Jennifer has the details.
- Programs: Ken Barker will be the presenter for the December meeting. Prior to Ken speaking, Linnea will be recruiting participants to attend a Hood River Public Review Hearing. See notes under Cooper Spur.
- Cooper Spur: The Hood River County Planning Commission determined the Cooper Spur area is not zoned for a destination resort. However, Mt Hood Meadows is requesting a zoning change exception. The Public Review & Comment Hearing will be held next month in Hood River. (The tentative date is December 18 at 7:00.) ONC members are urged to attend this meeting.
- Nordic Issues: Roy brought a map of the proposed Timberline Express Ski Lift. This lift will cross West Leg Road in several places. The new lift will expand the current ski area by 25 acres. The lift will be ready for use by the 2004 ski season. John Tullis, Timberline Public Affairs Director, would like to meet with ONC to discuss this new lift and its impact to the existing ski trail on West Leg Road. He is willing to put in some new cross-country ski trails in the area. A committee, which will include Roy and Klindt, will meet with John in the near future.
